

# Northern Research Station Timber & Watershed Laboratory

WV18 is sponsored and operated by the USDA Forest Service (USFS) and the Northern Research Station's Timber & Watershed Laboratory in Parsons, West Virginia. The site began collecting samples at the Northern Research Station's Timber & Watershed Laboratory on July 5, 1978. It is one of the first two sites in the network. John Pearce (pictured below) has been the site operator since 1985. Pam Edwards serves as backup operator and Freddie Wood is the site supervisor.

WV18 plays an integral part in the air quality research program at the Timber & Watershed Laboratory where staff also operate a CASTNET site, an IMPROVE site, and a high-elevation webcam and ozone monitoring site in cooperation with the Monongahela National Forest.
