

Virgin Islands National Park

The United States Virgin Islands (USVI) is a group of islands bordered by the Caribbean Sea and the Atlantic Ocean located approximately 50 miles east of Puerto Rico. The U.S. territory lies within the Lesser Antillean chain and consists of four main islands: St. Croix, St. Thomas, St. John, and Water Island. Although geographically isolated from the U.S. mainland, the USVI is commonly referred to as “America’s Paradise.”

Virgin Islands National Park is renowned for its pristine natural beauty and cultural history. The park is located on St. John, USVI, and covers approximately $\frac{3}{5}$ of the island. St. John is about 28 square miles and is only accessible by boat. Its crystal-clear blue waters support a diverse marine ecosystem and its pearl-white sandy beaches frame an abundance of terrestrial life within tropical dry forests. Relics from the Pre-Columbian Amerindian Civilization, remains of Danish Colonial Sugar Plantations, and an ethnically diverse society create the uniqueness of the Park and its island home.
