

NY20 Huntington Wildlife



The Huntington Wildlife Forest is a 15,000-acre field station in the center of the six million-acre Adirondack Park in northern New York. The station attracts scientists from throughout the world, providing a base of operation for research that seeks to understand the natural ecosystems of the northern forest, both on the property and throughout the Park. Facilities include modern housing, a cafeteria, and office space in a remote and spectacular wilderness setting. The property is operated by the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry (SUNY-ESF) in Syracuse, New York.

Collection of NTN samples at NY20 began on October 31, 1978, and samples for MDN have been collected at the site since December 10, 1999. The NTN site is sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and SUNY-ESF and operated by SUNY-ESF. The MDN site is sponsored by the New York State Energy Research & Development Authority (NYSERDA) and Syracuse University; it is operated by NYSERDA, Syracuse University, and SUNY-ESF. Myron Mitchell supervises the NTN site and Charles Driscoll supervises the MDN site. Ray Masters (at right) has operated NY20 since 1978 and Charlotte Demers is his backup.
